Advising & Academic Support

- >A first-year seminar in which the instructor is the student's advisor.
- Encourage student exploration, especially in the first year.
- >GE that is clear (easy to understand and explain) and with fewer required courses.

International & Off-Campus Studies/ACE

- > Maintain a high level of participation in off-campus study, including GE.
- > Reduce costs of off-campus study.
- >Implement a consistent, clear transfer policy and procedure for off-campus study.

Libraries & Information Technology (DiSCO)

- ➤ Learn a range of digital and information literacy skills and concepts in a variety of courses, both within their fields of study and across disciplines.
- ➤ Use digital and information literacy concepts in progressively more challenging questions and projects, culminating in a substantial multimodal (capstone) project.

- > Create a first-year seminar in which students gain a more in-depth understanding of a liberal arts education, "college knowledge," and resources to support their academic success.
- > Develop opportunities for students to articulate the knowledge and skills gained from their education so that they acquire the rapidly changing knowledge and skills that graduates need to succeed in today's world.

Registrar's Office

- > Revise transfer policies related to GE.
- >Simplify, clarify, and reduce the number of GE requirements.
