

Call for Creative Project Proposals: Gimse *Striving for Peace on Horizon's Brim* Art Endowment

The Gimse *Striving for Peace on Horizon's Brim* Art Endowment supports a wide range of creative projects on the St. Olaf campus that demonstrate a commitment to peace and global justice and foster a greater understanding and respect for the diversity of humanity.

Faculty, staff, and students are invited to apply for funds to support a creative project on campus. Preference will be given to projects located at the *Striving for Peace On Horizon's Brim* site, but projects located elsewhere on campus are also eligible for funding. Creative projects could include (but are not limited to) temporary exhibitions or installations, participatory or experiential artworks, video or film screenings, performances, poetry or other creative writing, and more.

Applications should include a description of the creative activity envisioned, a timeline, a total budget for the project specifying how an award ranging from \$2,000 — \$12,000 would be used, and a description of how the project will be promoted and available to members of the St. Olaf and larger community.

Submission Guidelines:

Submit proposals as a single document (PDF), which includes:

- the names of the proposers;
- the title of the proposed project;
- *a full description of the creative project;
- a short summary of the project that can be used for announcements and other public uses (40 words maximum);
- a timeline for project activities;
- a total budget for the project, including the place of a Gimse award in the project budget;
 - Note: If the project will receive additional funding from other sources, the proposal should include an explanation of how all funds will be allocated in the project budget.
- a statement of how the creative activity will be promoted and shared with the public;
- a brief statement of support from a representative of a department or program.

* Public art displays located at a site on campus other than the *Striving for Peace On Horizon's Brim* site must first receive approval from the public art committee. These are temporary exhibits and the proposal must include a start date and end date for the installation. Applications should be submitted via email to the Associate Dean of Fine Arts by March 1, 2025.

A review committee convened by the Associate Dean of Fine Arts will announce recipients of the awards by May 1, 2025.

Eligibility Checklist

My proposal includes:

- A creative project
- A theme that demonstrates a commitment to humanity, peace, global justice, and diversity.
- Departmental or programmatic support (signature of department or program chair)
- A faculty or staff sponsor (students only)
