709 seniors have declared 1,020 majors and 386 concentrations.

421 (59%) have one major, 268 (37%) have two majors, 17 (2%) have three majors and 3 have four majors.

245 (34%) have one concentration, 58 (8%) have two concentrations, 7 (1%) have three concentrations and 1 has four concentrations
