Bible Story Reflection

The story of Rahab in Joshua 2 showcases the extraordinary faith and courage of a woman faced with a life-altering decision. Activity Suggestions

- 2. Throughout your day, find an opportunity to extend the love of God to someone that society might overlook.
- 3. Using a red piece of yarn or string, create a symbol of faith and courage. Place this symbol somewhere you can be reminded of the faith you should have over fear like Rahab.
