Give examples.*

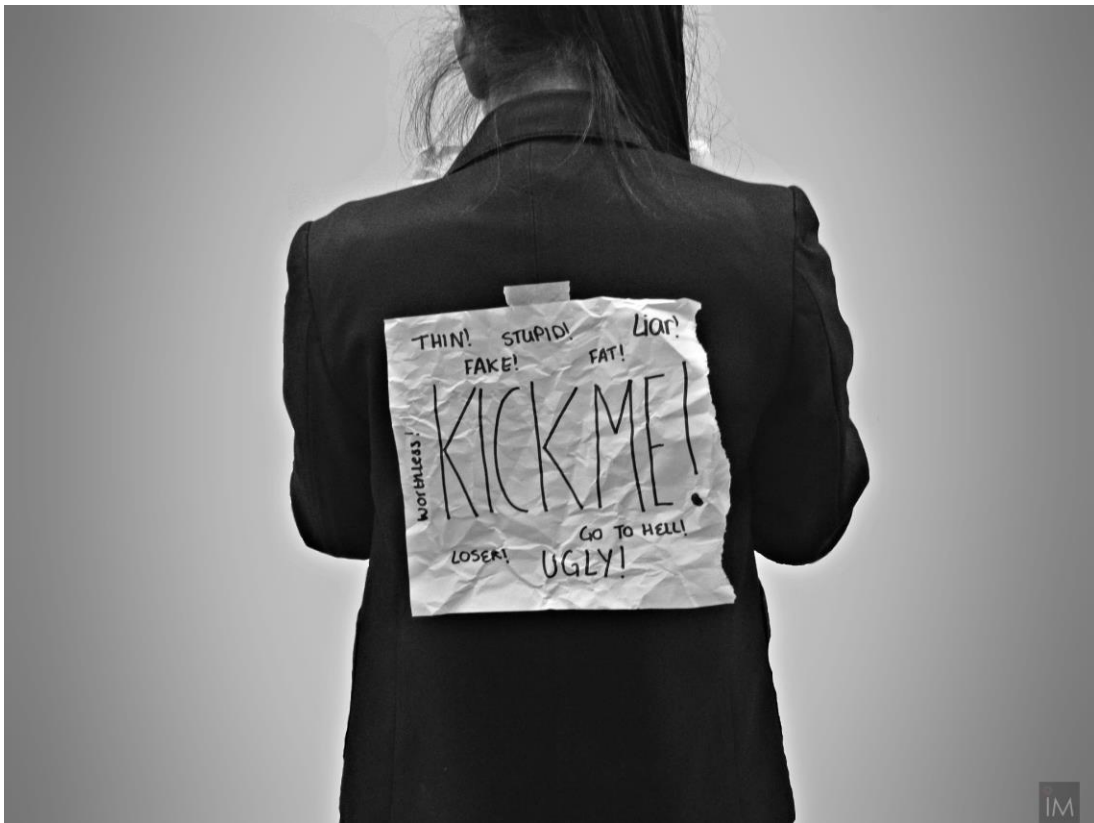

Activity Suggestions

2. Think of someone in your life who could benefit from a courageous intervention. Write them a letter expressing your concern and offering support and encouragement.
3. Spend time 5 minutes in silent reflection, seeking God’s guidance on situations where intervention may be needed. Pray for courage and discernment to intervene when called upon.
